C-VILLE SCULPTURE

YOU'LL NEED:

A C-VILLE Weekly
Masking Tape (or whatever kind you have)
Paint Brushes (1 for paint + 1 for glue)
Balloon
Paper Maché Glue (recipe below)
Scissors
Paint

Optional: Glitter, beads, tissue paper, hot glue

If you don't have Paper Maché Paste, make it from scratch!

1. Mix 1 part flour, 2 parts water in a large bowl.
2. Stir until lumps are gone and it is thin.
3. Add more flour or water if mixture is too thin or too thick. The consistency should be like white glue or pancake mix.
4. Store in the refrigerator

INSTRUCTIONS:

(Before you begin, make your paper maché paste from scratch if you don't have any at home)

1. Blow your balloon and tie it into a circle.
(If you don't have a balloon - you will want to create the mold from crumpled paper and tape)
2. Tape balloon into perfect bagel shape.
3. Take 3-4 full pages from your C-VILLE and cut them in half *(vertically)*.
4. Wrap your strips of paper around the balloon and start to make your bagel mold. *(You may need to crumple some pieces up to round out the shape)* - tape your paper with the masking tape as you go to achieve that perfect bagel shape.
5. Get your C-VILLE again - and cut a lot of little square or rectangular pieces of paper and gather your paper mache paste/brush.
6. Do a light layer on top of your sculpture form - and attach some of the smaller pieces. You will continue to layer these pieces / paste until you are pleased with it. Do at least 7 layers (minimum). *(Make sure to place some pieces along the center / edge of the bagel as well)*.
7. Smooth out the surface by lightly brushing a final layer of the paste on the outside.

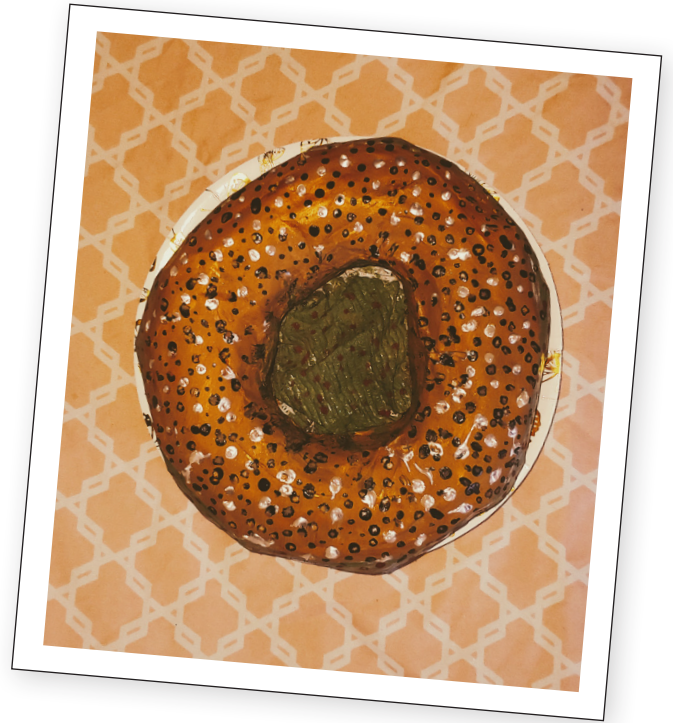


8. Let it dry!! This will take about a full day.
Be patient.

9. Paint your bagel - I started with a few layers of acrylic - and once that dried I did some watercolor on top for dimension. (*Let it dry once again before step 10*).

10. Add in the details - Use whatever you like for this. I used small beads for the poppy seeds - and tissue paper for jalapeno cream cheese.

11. Your paper maché Bodo's bagel is all done!
Enjoy your new sculpture!
